## *It's Not A Mercury, But It's Just As Good*

For Allen Alby, his 1946 Ford convertible has enough styling cues to remind him of the 1947 Mercury convertible he had as a teenager, and that makes this Ford a special car for him.

Allen bought the car in 1999 from Randy DeBoer, but it didn't look anything like what you see today. It was all stok, had no motor and needed a lot of work.

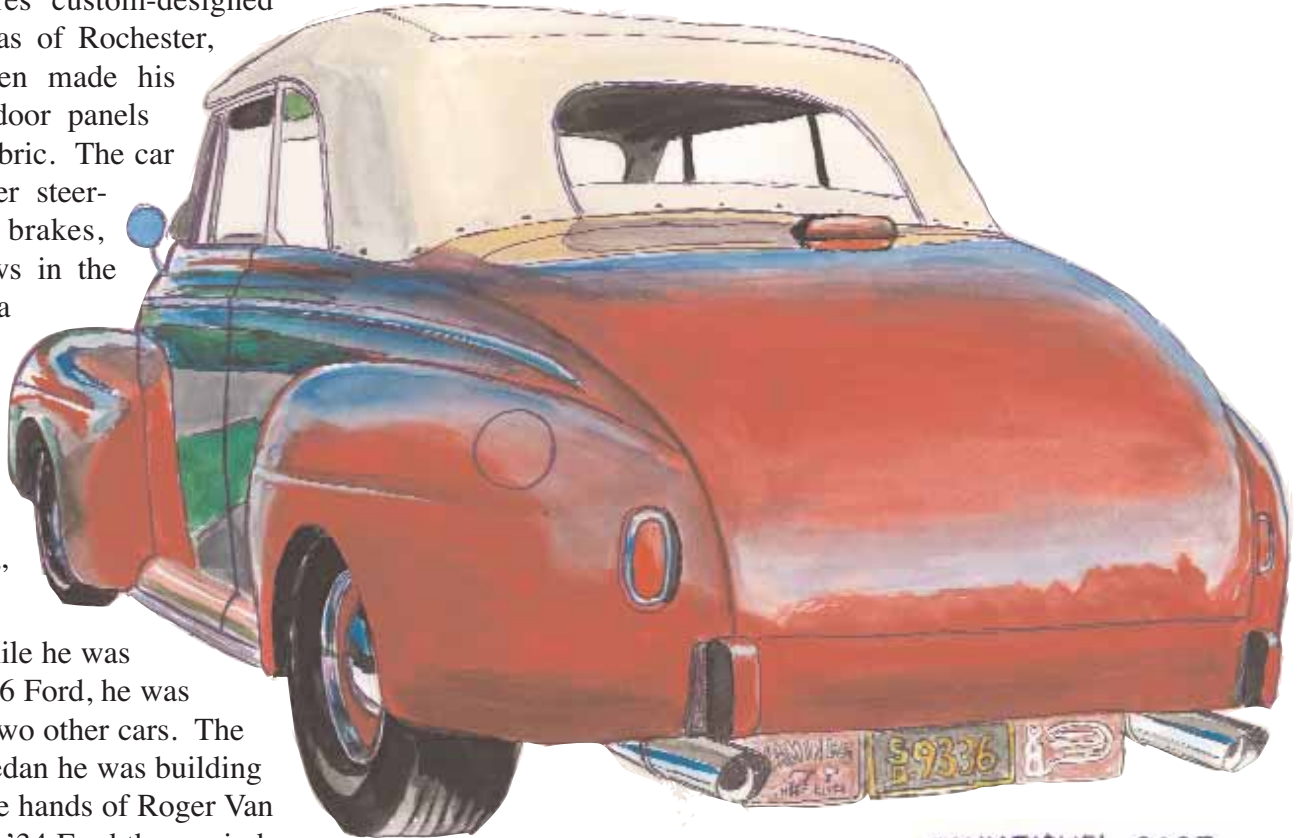
"It was all in pieces," Allen said.

Now the pieces, some of which have Allen's custom touch, fit together nicely, and the car runs fast with a Chevy 355 crate motor Allen got from a local Chevrolet dealer. The headlights and taillights are Frenched, the bumpers removed and Nerf bars were installed in the back. Under the crate motor is a Mustang II front-end, and a 400 automatic transmission shifts the gears for Allen. The interior features custom-designed seats from Teas of Rochester, MN, and Allen made his own custom door panels of the same fabric. The car also has power steering, power brakes, power windows in the front and a Pioneer stereo system.

"It took me about a year and a half to build this one," Allensaid.

But while he was building his '46 Ford, he was also building two other cars. The 1934 Chevy sedan he was building ended up in the hands of Roger Van Noort, and the '34 Ford three-window coupe was also sold. But the maroon '46 Ford convertible is a keeper. Allen said besides the nostalgia of the Mercury he drove as a teenager, he also likes this car because it has been a dependable vehicle.

"I can drive it anywhere, I don't have to worry about it," Allen said.

## Holiday Recipes To Try

One of the deserts at the car club Christmas party earlier this month was very popular, so Audrey Jorgenson was generous enough to share the recipe with our club.

### Kit Kat Bars

1 cup butter  
 1/2 cup brown sugar  
 1-1/3 cup sugar  
 1/2 cup milk  
 2 cups crushed graham crackers  
 1/2 box Keebler Club crackers (1-1/2 sleeves)  
 2/3 cup peanut butter  
 1/2 cup chocolate chips  
 1/2 cup butterscotch chips  
 Bring to a boil the butter, brown sugar, white sugar, milk and crushed graham crackers.  
 Boil 5 minutes.  
 Line bottom of 9x13 pan with Keebler crackers.  
 Put 1/2 of the boiled mixture over crackers, then another layer of crackers, followed by the rest of the boiled mixture.  
 Melt chips and peanut butter in microwave and pour over top and spread.  
 Refrigerate to set.  
 Then enjoy!

If you're really getting festive at this point, and want to do more holiday baking, here is another recipe from the grandmother of an

individual who wishes to remain anonymous:

### Classic Christmas Cookie Recipe

1 cup of water  
 1 tsp baking soda  
 1 cup of sugar  
 1 tsp salt  
 1 cup of brown sugar  
 Lemon juice  
 4 large eggs  
 1 cup nuts  
 2 cups of dried fruit  
 1 bottle Crown Royal (may substitute any liquor of choice)  
 Sample the Crown Royal to check quality.  
 Take a large bowl, check the Crown Royal again, to be sure it is of the highest quality, pour one level cup and drink. Turn on the electric mixer...Beat one cup of butter in a large fluffy bowl. Add one teaspoon of sugar....Beat again. At this point it's best to make sure the Crown Royal is still OK; try another cup.... just in case.  
 Turn off the mixer thingy.  
 Break 2 leggs and add to the bowl and chuck in the cup of dried fruit.  
 Pick the frickin fruit off the floor...  
 Mix on the turner.  
 If the fried druit gets stuck in the beaters just pry it loose with a dewscriver.  
 Then sample the Crown Royal to check for consistency.  
 Then, sift two cups of salt, or something.... who giveshz a sheet.  
 Take another shot of the Crown Royal.  
 Now shift the lemon juice and strain your nuts.  
 Add one table.

Add a spoon of basking yoda, or somefink.... whatever you can find.  
Greash the oven.  
Turn the cake tin 360 degrees and try not to fall over.  
Don't forget to beat off the turner.  
Finish the bottle of Crown Royal.  
Make sure to put the stove in the dishwasher.  
If not already in a prone position, lie down – the bookies will cake themselves from here on.
