Thotographs and Memories by Tom Olsen

I'm a car guy and veteran Great Plains
Street Rodder from Sioux Falls who developed
an interest in cars in the early 1960s, and that
passion has been with me all these years. Each
month I'll share a picture or two in the newsletter
and will offer a short narrative on each for your
enjoyment. While I'm primarily a Chevy guy, I'll
do my best to mix things up a bit so everyone
sees something they might enjoy.



I can't resist showing you pictures of one of my favorite race cars ever: the "Yoo Hoo Too" '56 Chevy Sedan Delivery campaigned by Wayne Jesel out of Duffy's Speed Shop in Red Bank, New Jersey. Both of these pictures were taken at the races in Englishtown, New Jersy, while I was stationed near there in the army. (Yes, that's me as a 21 year old.) This particular car had the 265 cubic inch, 245 horsepower engine, which was the "Corvette" style engine with dual 4-barrell carbs, solid lifter cam, and special cylinder heads. It used a GM Hydramatic transmission, which gave it a tremendous advantage over other production '56 Chevy transmissions. This car ran well under the national record for years and won at several national meets. In the October '67 photo (photo on the left), the car was running in G/Stock Automatic; by 1969 the car was blue and white and was in M/Stock Automatic, I owned two different '56 Sedan Deliveries over the years, neither of them made it to quite this level...

Recipe

Apple Cranberry Slaw
