He has always done all of his own work, whether it be mechanical, body work or paint at his own body shop in Harrisburg. These days, however, after being sort of retired, the body shop has become a build or storage location for Ken's own personal projects.

Eleven years ago, a friend asked Ken if he could find a 1961 Chevy bubble top car for him



like one he had in high school. With that request, Ken enlisted a buddy he has in Rapid City to help with the search. A couple weeks later a car was found in Mitchell and brought to Sioux Falls by his buddy from Rapid City. Bringing the interested party together with the '61 Chevy, the sale was immediate. Ken was also having a hard time not drooling over the car, too. With only 45,000 original miles, the soft-yellow exterior, six-cylinder and three-speed, it was a very desirable car. Before the car went away, Ken mentioned to his friend that if he ever wanted to sell the car to let him know. Then in August of 2011, ten years had gone by with the owners of the '61 Chevy losing interest, and Ken was called. It didn't take long, and Ken had the 1961 Chevy he had looked at 10 years earlier in his shop in Harrisburg. He was surprised to see that it had been driven only 200 miles during the time they had it. Ken put the car in a corner of his shop 'til February 2012 while he thought about what he would do with it.

Once he had his ideas, the six-cylinder stick combination came out and a 350 with a five-speed went in. After installing power steering and brakes, he got heavy into detailing the body with wet sanding the entire 20-year-old repaint job with 2,000-grit sand paper and rubbing it out. New outside trim and Torque Thrust wheels were added finishing the picture bringing the car right back into the 60s again really making a statement when seen today. Now there are other people drooling around the car instead of Ken who is usually standing back smiling. Out of all the cars Ken has built and sold over the years, this one is his wife Susan's favorite because of its total original inside and outside appearance. If I know Susan, I doubt this '61 Chevy will ever be sold!



Thotographs and Memories by Tom Olsen

I'm a car guy and veteran Great Plains Street Rodder from Sioux Falls who developed an interest in cars in the early 1960s, and that passion has been with me all these years. Each month I'll share a picture or two in the newsletter and will offer a short narrative on each for your enjoyment. While I'm primarily a Chevy guy, I'll do my best to mix things up a bit so everyone sees something they might enjoy.



Sweet Little Chevy II

GPSR member Bill Kullander bought this sky blue 1962 Chevy II Nova convertible in May of 1962, two hours after it was parked on the showroom floor at Jay-Shon Chevrolet, here in Sioux Falls. The car was equipped with a 194 ci, 120hp six-cylinder engine and three-speed column-shifted transmission. Two weeks after buying the car, Bill and friend Daryl Vanderploeg installed a Hurst floor shift at Park Ridge Texaco (26th and Western). Later, Missile Muffler "split" the exhaust manifold and installed dual exhaust; this gave the six-cylinder engine more performance and a very unique sound. Bob Schriever (Missile Muffler) also designed a carb adaptor for a larger carburetor, which further enhanced performance.

Bill bought a pair of 13-inch "cheater slicks" and mounted them on a spare set of Chevy II rims, and he was ready to go drag racing with the Sioux Falls "Chevy Racing Team"! According to Bill, the light-weight, six-cylinder powered car sent the NHRA classification team into a "real tizzy" each time Bill showed up to race the little convertible. They eventually classified him into the lowest class available at the time: M/Street Stock. Bill won five class trophies in five outings with the car. Only once did he have competition in the class; a Ford Falcon that he beat by a couple car lengths in the quarter mile. I remember being at Sioux City watching Bill race the convertible; a buddy of mine and I hauled his slicks down in my friend's dad's station wagon. (I even have movies.) We were proud to be Bill's pseudo "pit crew"!

This car was also Bill and Lana's honeymoon car; they drove the convertible to Minneapolis in a blinding snowstorm on Dec. 21, 1963, for a threeday honeymoon at the Curtis Hotel. Bill sold the car in the summer of '64, and within a few short months the car was totaled in a car crash and spent its last days at Arndt's wrecking – a sad ending to a sweet little Chevy II.
