

1961 Sioux Falls Coliseum Car Show

This beautiful 1927 Ford pickup was on display in a car show at the old Sioux Falls Coliseum in 1961. The car was a "Candy Green" color with white Naugahyde interior, chrome wheels and an assortment of other chrome dress-up items. It was powered by a Ford flathead and my notes on the back of the picture indicate it had two 2-barrell carbs. The car was also complimented by a very nice display (for the times) including gas can, tools and tool chest, flares, road reflectors, etc. The car was owned by Aron and Tony Peterson out of Fridley, MN. This particular car show was put on by Jack Portice and sponsored by the Eliminators Car Club. In looking on the internet, I see that Jack Portice still puts on car and motorcycle shows today.


