
# What a Fun Year It Was!

# A Journey Back to Youth

A lot of car enthusiasts choose a special car they want based on what they had in their first years of driving. But Ken and Vickie Levene decided to take it a step further.

"What I was looking for, was when I was a youth the first car my parents ever let me drive was a 1959 Ford Custom 300 two-door sedan," Ken explained.

Finding a 1958 Ford two-door shouldn't bee too hard. Ford made a lot of them; over 228,000.

"I was looking online," Ken continued, "and I thought that if that was cool, a Ranchero would be even cooler"
